We need wellies.

At the beginning of the term, I spoke about our plans to use indoor and outdoor shoes in school. If you have not yet sent wellies into school, please do so as soon as possible. Without wellies, children will not be able to take part in their lessons in forest school or the outdoor area.

If you are struggling to provide wellies, please let us know because we may be able to help.

Head Lice is in school

You can treat head lice without seeing a GP: Treat head lice as soon as you spot them.

You should check everyone in the house and start treating anyone who has head lice on the same day. keep your child off school if they have head lice. Wet combing There's no need to

Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing. You should try this

You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits.

There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you: wash hair with ordinary shampoo apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)

comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends It usually takes about 10 minutes to comb short hair, and 20 to 30 minutes for long, frizzy or curly hair.

Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17.
