Phonics/Spelling

In year 2, phonics is still a strategy that children should use; however children should be beginning to develop their word-specific knowledge of spelling and be taught spelling rules.

Children are expected to be able to spell common exception words (please speak to your child's teacher if you would like a list of these) as well as words with contracted forms (e.g. don't). They should also be able to spell words with the suffixes -ment - ness -ful -less - ly

Handwriting

The Kinetic letters scheme is used to teach

Children how to form lower case and capital letters that are of the correct size in relation to each other. They continue to develop correct formation of digits and use spacing between words which reflect the size of letters.

Using horizontal and diagonal strokes is also taught in order to begin the teaching of joined up handwriting.

Sentence Structure

Children are taught to extend sentences by using subordinating conjunctions (when, if, that, because) and coordinating conjunctions (or, and, but)

Children are taught to use expanded noun phrases, for example the butterfly becomes, the blue butterfly.

Punctuation

In Year 2 children continue to practise and develop the skills of using finger spaces, full stops, capital letters., question marks and exclamation marks.

They are also taught how to use **commas** to separate items in a list as well as **apostrophes** to show where letters are missing, e.g. don't as well as showing singular possession, e.g. the girl's coat.

Grammar

Children are taught how to recognise and write a **statement**, a **question**, an **exclamation** and a **command**. Children are taught to add suffixes (ment, ness. ful, less, ly) to words
