Reception writing



Phonics/Spelling

Phase 2, 3 and 4 are taught. In Phase 2 phonemes (sounds) are introduced and linked to graphemes (letter/letters which represent the sound).



Children are encouraged to use the sounds that they learn in their writing. Hearing these and blending them together to create words.

At St James we use StoryTime phonics to teach Phonics.

Our main approach to spelling in Reception is applying **phonic**sounds to words but we do encourage children to spell some

irregular words correctly too, such; as the, to, no, I, go

Handwriting

In Reception we continue to build on body
strength and hand strength so that children have good
coordination in large and small movements.
We use the Kinetic Letters scheme to teach the letter
families and where the different letters should start.
We continue to perfect the letter moves: up, down,
push, pull, slide, flick.

Sentence Structure

In Reception children are taught to write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others.



Punctuation

In Reception children learn to use finger spaces to





separate words, full stops to end a sentence and capital letters to start a sentence

Grammar

Children are taught what a sentence is and how to write a simple sentence.
