#### Testing in schools to stop the spread of the virus

Education Secretary Gavin Williamson has said: 'Over 49 million rapid COVID-19 tests have been conducted by students and staff at schools across England since Monday 4 January. Building regular twice-weekly testing into routines has been critical in reaching this milestone number of tests to keep the virus out of schools and colleges. We must all continue testing. This asymptomatic testing helps break chains of transmission by taking people who are infectious but don't know it out of circulation. As we head towards the end of this challenging academic year, please keep testing and reporting."
