Covid-19 update:

Whilst there is now hope that next term may be able to return to a bit more of a normal, we are not there yet. The importance of following government and local guidance remains. Please do your best to avoid journeys and mixing with other households. As the end of term approaches we face the challenge that if we have any cases, I will need to advise you of the need for your child to self-isolate. I very much hope that this will not be necessary.

If any of your children begin to display any Covid-19 symptoms – even after we have broken up, please remember to book a test. If the test is positive, it is essential that you contact me, so that the system of Contact & Trace can work.

Please message me on Class Dojo. I will check at 4.00 p.m. every day between 19^{th} – 24^{th} December. If there is positive test result after symptoms have developed within 48 hours of school breaking up, I will post a message on the page of the class who has had contact, at 4.00 p.m. Please do look out for it. If this happens, in line with national guidance, your child would need to stay at home and self-isolate until 31^{st} December (14 days after contact). Other members of your household can continue normal activities, provided your child does not develop symptoms within the self-isolation period.

The Department for Education coronavirus helpline will still be open over the Christmas holidays to answer any questions you may have relating to education settings. They will however, close on the bank holidays.
