#### Covid-19 reminder:

I wrote last week, about the arrangements for test and trace for the start of the Christmas holidays. Please <u>only</u> message me if your child develops symptoms over the weekend

Please message me on Class Dojo. I will check at 4.00 p.m. every day between 19<sup>th</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup> December.

If a positive test result is reported, I will notify you via Class Dojo. Please do look out for it. If this happens, in line with national guidance, your child would need to stay at home and self-isolate for <u>10</u> days after contact. Other members of your household can continue normal activities, provided your child does not develop symptoms within the self-isolation period.
