Stay Safe

Online Safety Tip: Keep personal information professional and limited. You would not hand over purely personal information to strangers, even one stranger, so please do not hand it out to millions of people online. No one should know your address.



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Safeguarding Safety Tip: Keep your children safe away from home by: talking to them about what to do if they got lost, about the dangers of traffic and about 'stranger danger'. Your guidance can help your child keep themselves safe. It will also help build their self confidence and independence.

We have a strong reading curriculum at St James, please see below for one of the reasons why.

Did you know that children (and adults) who read for pleasure have higher self-esteem, cope better in difficult situations and have better sleeping patterns? Please read regularly with your child; at least 3 times per week.

The Department of Education (DfE) have made attendance a focus for this academic year because the pandemic has led to renewed concerns about absence from school and its potential impact on attainment and wellbeing. Please see the document listed above for details.

It states that children can only miss school if either:

- They are too ill to go in
- Advance permission from school has been given.
 (Please remember that permission cannot be given for holidays.)

If you take your child out of school without permission any one of the following could happen:

- a Parenting Order is issued
- an Education Supervision Order is issued
- a School Attendance Order is issued
- a fine (sometimes known as a 'penalty notice') is given

Our school's current attendance = 95.2%

This means that we have already fallen below our target of 96%.

There is time to improve this - if those children already on our attendance tracking list come into school regularly.

Thank you to those parents who ensure their children are in school and on time.
