This week's book recommendation




If your child is a reluctant reader - this may be the book to excite them.

Attendance



It is really disappointing to see that our attendance level is continuing to fall. It currently stands at 88%, which is very low. It is well below our target and below national standard too. This sharp drop is mainly attributable to children not being in school because they have gone on holiday. Every year group has had absence as a result of this, especially our youngest children.

Please do your best to ensure your children are in school everyday.

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Attendance during one school year	equals this number of days absent	which is approximately this many weeks absent	which means this number of lessons missed
95%	9 days	2 weeks	50 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons
85%	29 days	6 weeks	150 lessons
80%	38 days	8 weeks	200 lessons
